### **Connection to Chapter 19**




Connection to Chapter 19 – "His vision for them has been astounding—the two superpowers would be joined to tiny Judah as one people in one world under one God (19:23–25). Is this credible? To prove that it is, Isaiah records an incident showing that precisely these world empires—in the heyday of their power—are subject to the word of the Lord. Nothing, therefore, is impossible."

## **Sign Against Cush and Egypt**

<sup>20:1</sup> In the year that the commander in chief, who was sent by Sargon the king of Assyria, came to Ashdod and fought against it and captured it 2 at that time the Lord spoke by Isaiah the son of Amoz, saying, "Go, and loose the sackcloth from your waist and take off your sandals from your feet," and he did so, walking naked and barefoot. <sup>3</sup> Then the Lord said, "As my servant Isaiah has walked naked and barefoot for three years as a sign and a portent against Egypt and Cush,






- "God Spoke by Isaiah"

- Enacted Prophesy...Visual Aid!?





## Sign Against Cush and Egypt

<sup>4</sup> so shall the king of Assyria lead away the Egyptian captives and the Cushite exiles, both the young and the old, naked and barefoot, with buttocks uncovered, the nakedness of Egypt.

<sup>5</sup> Then they shall be dismayed and ashamed because of Cush their hope and of Egypt their boast. <sup>6</sup> And the inhabitants of this coastland will say in that day, 'Behold, this is what has happened to those in whom we hoped and to whom we fled for help to be delivered from the king of Assyria! And we, how shall we escape?' "



# Isaiah 21:1&2 Babylon is Fallen




<sup>21:1</sup> The oracle concerning the wilderness of the sea. As whirlwinds in the Negeb sweep on, it comes from the wilderness, from a terrible land.

<sup>2</sup> A stern vision is told to me; the traitor betrays, and the destroyer destroys. Go up, O Elam; lay siege, O Media; all the sighing she has caused I bring to an end.




# Isaiah 21:5 & 6 Babylon is Fallen



<sup>5</sup> They prepare the table, they spread the rugs, they eat, they drink. Arise, O princes; oil the shield! <sup>6</sup> For thus the Lord said to me: "Go, set a watchman; let him announce what he sees.



# Isaiah 21:9 & 10 Babylon is Fallen



<sup>9</sup> And behold, here come riders, horsemen in pairs!" And he answered, "Fallen, fallen is Babylon; and all the carved images of her gods he has shattered to the ground." <sup>10</sup> O my threshed and winnowed one, what I have heard from the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, I announce to you.




- **Babylon Will Fall Again!**
- Isaiah 13:19; 47:5; 9: 48:14
- Jeremiah 51:8
- Revelation 14:8; 16:19, 17-18

- Who is setting the table?
- According to Zenophon...The Persian Army Marched in Pairs
- Watchman's Report:
  - Riders in Pairs...Announced Babylon's Fall
- Babylon Fell...
  - To Assyrians in 710, 702, 689, and 648 BC
  - To Medes/Persians in 539 BC
- Babylon Will Fall again!



- Yahweh Causes Kedar's Defeat!




