





¹Ah, the proud crown of the drunkards of Ephraim, and the fading flower of its glorious beauty, which is on the head of the rich valley of those overcome with wine!



Ah / Woe





- Is 1:4 **Ah**, sinful nation, a people laden with iniquity, offspring of evildoers, children who deal corruptly! They have forsaken the LORD, they have despised the Holy One of Israel, they are utterly estranged.
- Is 1:24 Therefore the Lord declares, the LORD of hosts, the Mighty One of Israel: **"Ah**, I will get relief from my enemies and avenge myself on my foes.
- Is 17:12 **Ah**, the thunder of many peoples; they thunder like the thundering of the sea! Ah, the roar of nations; they roar like the roaring of mighty waters!
- Is 18:1 **Ah**, land of whirring wings that is beyond the rivers of Cush,
- Is 28:1 **Ah**, the proud crown of the drunkards of Ephraim, and the fading flower of its glorious beauty, which is on the head of the rich valley of those overcome with wine!
- Is 29:1 **Ah**, Ariel, Ariel, the city where David encamped! Add year to year; let the feasts run their round.
- Is 29:15 **Ah**, you who hide deep from the LORD your counsel, whose deeds are in the dark, and who say, "Who sees us? Who knows us?"
- Is 30:1 **"Ah**, stubborn children," declares the LORD, "who carry out a plan, but not mine, and who make an alliance, but not of my Spirit, that they may add sin to sin;
- Is 33:1 **Ah**, you destroyer, who yourself have not been destroyed, you traitor, whom none has betrayed! When you have ceased to destroy, you will be destroyed; and when you have finished betraying, they will betray you.

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- Is 31:1 **Woe** to those who go down to Egypt for help and rely on horses, who trust in chariots because they are many and in horsemen because they are very strong, but do not look to the Holy One of Israel or consult the LORD!



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


Failing Covenant



¹⁴Therefore hear the word of the Lord, you scoffers, who rule this people in Jerusalem! ¹⁵Because you have said, “We have made a covenant with death, and with Sheol we have an agreement, when the overwhelming whip passes through it will not come to us, for we have made lies our refuge, and in falsehood we have taken shelter”; ¹⁶therefore thus says the Lord God, “Behold, I am the one who has laid as a foundation in Zion, a stone, a tested stone, a precious cornerstone, of a sure foundation: ‘Whoever believes will not be in haste.’ ¹⁷And I will make justice the line, and righteousness the plumb line; and hail will sweep away the refuge of lies, and waters will overwhelm the shelter.” ¹⁸Then your covenant with death will be annulled, and your agreement with Sheol will not stand; when the overwhelming scourge passes through, you will be beaten down by it. ¹⁹As often as it passes through it will take you; for morning by morning it will pass through, by day and by night; and it will be sheer terror to understand the message.

Failing Covenant



- Isaiah employs a mocking tone – they certainly hadn't said they made a covenant with death
- Judah had sought shelter outside of the living God
- “Behold, I am the one who has laid a foundation...” – either God the Father or pointing to the coming Messiah
- “Hail” and “waters” – harkens back to verse 17
- Peter points back to this Isaiah passage – 1 Peter 2:4-10


Isaiah 28:23-29

A Call for Repentance

²³Give ear, and hear my voice; give attention, and hear my speech. ²⁴Does he who plows for sowing plow continually? Does he continually open and harrow his ground? ²⁵When he has leveled its surface, does he not scatter dill, sow cumin, and put in wheat in rows and barley in its proper place, and emmer as the border? ²⁶For he is rightly instructed; his God teaches him. ²⁷Dill is not threshed with a threshing sledge, nor is a cart wheel rolled over cumin, but dill is beaten out with a stick, and cumin with a rod. ²⁸Does one crush grain for bread? No, he does not thresh it forever; when he drives his cart wheel over it with his horses, he does not crush it. ²⁹This also comes from the Lord of hosts; he is wonderful in counsel and excellent in wisdom.

Isaiah 28:23-29

Two Parables



Planting Seed

- Scatter dill, sow cumin, and put in wheat in rows...
- Each action has discrimination in how the seed is planted
- Will God not show discrimination in how he responds to Samaria and Judah?
- Earlier in this chapter Isaiah offered a promise of blessing (vv. 5-6), but later he promised blasting (vv. 14-22). God would use both instruments to deal with His people. Using both was not inconsistent. - Constable

Threshing / Crushing

- Dill – threshed with a threshing sledge
- Cumin – rolled over with a cart wheel
- Dill – beaten out with a stick
- God will demonstrate purposeful, knowing action.
- Each crop has to be gathered in a way appropriate to it; the wrong treatment would destroy the crop. - Motyer
- Vs 29 “He is wonderful in counsel and excellent in wisdom.”

Recurring Themes

- God's hatred of pride. We started off with this in verses 1 and 3 - Isaiah calls out "the **proud** crown of the drunkards of Ephraim"
- Failure to lead and direct the people - particularly due to drunkenness - vs 7
- Putting hope in something else other than God (vs 14-19)
- Despite the failure of leadership, God will provide one who is just and righteous (vs 16/17)

Conclusion

- Fight Pride - Philippians 2 pointed us to Christ's humility. We need to walk humbly before our God and Savior. James 4:10 – "Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will exalt you."
- Seek to be receptive to God's Word and His commands.
- Put our hope and faith in the **"precious cornerstone, of a sure foundation"**
- Rest in Him – Matthew 11:28-30

²⁸ "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."


