#### Isaiah 38:1-3



Isaiah's Message to King Hezekiah and Hezekiah's Prayer

**1**In those days Hezekiah became ill and was at the point of death. The prophet Isaiah son of Amoz went to him and said, "This is what the LORD says: **Put your house in order, because you are going to die**; you will not recover."

**2Hezekiah turned his face to the wall and prayed** to the LORD, **3**"**Remember**, LORD, how I have walked before you faithfully and with wholehearted devotion and have done what is good in your eyes." And Hezekiah wept bitterly.



#### In Those Days...



Isaiah's Message to King Hezekiah and Hezekiah's Prayer

Hezekiah was:

**25** years old when he began to reign as king (2 Kings 18:1)

- + 29 years he reigned (2 Kings 18:1)
  - 54 years old when he died (2 Kings 18:1)
- 15 years added to his life (Isaiah 38:6)

**39** years old when he was **sick unto death** (Isaiah 38:1)

**39** years old when **Sennarcherib king Assyria attacked all the fortified cities** of Judah and captured them (2 Kings 18:13; Isaiah 36:1)



#### Wept Bitterly



Isaiah's Message to King Hezekiah and Hezekiah's Prayer

"His **bitter tears** showed the **depth of his sorrow**. He would **apparently die without an heir to the throne, in the full strength of this manhood, and with his nation in an unsettled state**." – Dr. Constable's Notes on Isaiah, page 241

"Hezekiah was one of the most truly human of the kings, and his portrait here accords with what is recorded elsewhere. He was a man whose heart was genuinely moved towards the Lord but whose will was fickle under the pressures and temptations of life. Like the David who was his ancestor, and unlike the greater David who was his descendant, his first thoughts were for himself. On hearing of his imminent death his only cry amounted to 'I do not want to die' (38:2-3)." – J. Alex Motyer



#### Isaiah 38:1-3



Isaiah's Message to King Hezekiah and Hezekiah's Prayer

- In those days... (timestamp)
  - Identifies the event of Isaiah 36-37 (Assyrian siege of Jerusalem)
  - Hezekiah's severe illness
- You are **going to die**...
  - Isaiah delivers God's warning and edict
  - Hezekiah turned to God in prayer
  - Hezekiah pleaded for God to remember his faithful walk
  - Short prayer because of his weeping
  - Hezekiah has no heir

Hezekiah ... did what was right in the sight of the Lord, according to all that his father David had done.



#### Isaiah 38:1-3



Isaiah's Message to King Hezekiah and Hezekiah's Prayer

# How had Hezekiah walked faithfully with the Lord and with wholehearted devotion?

3And he did what was right in the eyes of the LORD, according to all that David his father had done. 4He **removed** the high places and **broke** the pillars and **cut down** the Asherah. And he broke in pieces the bronze serpent that Moses had made, for until those days the people of Israel had made offerings to it (it was called Nehushtan). 5He trusted in the LORD, the God of Israel, so that there was none like him among all the kings of Judah after him, nor among those who were before him. 6For he held fast to the LORD. He did not depart from following him, but kept the commandments that the LORD commanded Moses. 7And the LORD was with him; wherever he went out, he prospered. He rebelled against the king of Assyria and would not serve him. 8He struck down the Philistines as far as Gaza and its territory, from watchtower to fortified city. (2 Kings 18:3-8)



#### Isaiah 38:4-8



The LORD Answers Hezekiah's Prayer

**4**Then the word of the LORD came to Isaiah: **5**"Go and tell Hezekiah, 'This is what the LORD, the **God of your father David**, says: I have **heard your prayer** and **seen your tears**; I will **add fifteen years** to your life. **6**And I will deliver you and this city from the hand of the king of Assyria. I will defend this city.

7" 'This is the LORD's sign to you that the LORD will do what he has promised: 8I will make the shadow cast by the sun go back the ten steps it has gone down on the stairway of Ahaz.' " So the sunlight went back the ten steps it had gone down.



### Isaiah 38:4-6

The LORD Answers Hezekiah's Prayer



Isaiah 37:16-19

O Lord of hosts, God of Israel, who is enthroned above the cherubim, you are the God, you alone, of all the kingdoms of the earth; you have made heaven and earth.

Incline your ear, O Lord, and hear; open your eyes, O Lord, and see; and hear all the words of Sennacherib, which he has sent to mock the living God. Truly, O Lord, the kings of Assyria have laid waste all the nations and their lands, and have cast their gods into the . fire. For they were no gods, but the work of men's hands, wood and stone. Therefore they were destroyed.

• "God of your father David" (Reference to 2 Samuel 7?)

- Hezekiah's personal delivery from death
  - Heard your prayer, seen your tears, added 15 years (v6)
  - No comment on his faithfulness
  - "...mercy of the Lord that he hears our prayers even when they rest on false assumptions." - Motyer

#### Jerusalem's promised delivery from destruction (Isaiah 37:16-20)

- Incline your ear and hear (v17)
- **Open** your eyes and see (v17)
- Save us from his hand (v20)





# Eyes of the LORD



#### The LORD Answers Hezekiah's Prayer

- So she called on the name of the LORD who spoke to her, "You are a God of seeing," for she said, "Truly here I have seen him who looks after me." (Genesis 16:13) El Roi (roh-ee')
- But the eyes of the LORD are on those who fear him, on those whose hope is in his unfailing love... (Psalm 33:18)
- O LORD, you have searched me and known me! You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from afar. You search out my path and my lying down and are acquainted with all my ways. Even before a word is on my tongue, behold, O LORD, you know it altogether. (Psalm 139:1-4)
- The eyes of the LORD are everywhere, keeping watch on the wicked and the good. (Proverbs 15:3)
- The eye of the LORD search the whole earth in order to strengthen those whose hearts are fully committed to him. (2 Chronicles 16:9a)



### Eyes of the LORD



The LORD Answers Hezekiah's Prayer

"The ground on which prayer is answered is not human faithfulness, but the faithfulness of the God of your father David (5). He made promises to David and he does not depart from them in relation to David's sons. - Motyer

"The close association of Hezekiah's recovery with the city's deliverance suggests that the king epitomizes the city. Both Hezekiah and Jerusalem came to the threshold of death, but both were given a new lease on life because of the king's faithful deeds." Robert B. Chisholm Jr., Handbook on the Prophets, page 91



#### Add 15 Years...



The LORD Answers Hezekiah's Prayer

Hezekiah was:

- **39** years old when he was **sick unto death** (Isaiah 38:1)
- **39** years old when **Sennarcherib king of Assyria attacked all the fortified cities** of Judah and captured them (2 Kings 18:13; Isaiah 36:1)
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



### Isaiah 38:7-8



#### The LORD Answers Hezekiah's Prayer

- Hezekiah asked for a sign that the LORD would heal him (2 Kings 20:8)
- Isaiah gave Hezekiah two options, make the shadow to go forward ten steps or back ten? (2 Kings 20:9)
  - <sup>\*</sup>Hezekiah surmised it was **easier for the shadow to lengthen ten steps**, but **not to retreat ten** (2 Kings 20:10)
- Isaiah asked the LORD and He brought the shadow back the ten steps it had already descended on the stairway of Ahaz (2 Kings 20:11)







#### **Eyes of Hezekiah**




The LORD Answers Hezekiah's Prayer

"Evidently, whatever it was, Hezekiah could see it from his sickbed. The passing away of daylight on the stairway suggested the passing away of Hezekiah's life, and the return of sunlight symbolized the restoration of life." - Dr. Constable's Notes on Isaiah, page 242



### Isaiah 38:9-14



King Hezekiah's Response

- 9A writing of Hezekiah king of Judah after his illness and recovery:
- 10 I said, "In the prime of my life must I go through the gates of death and be robbed of the rest of my years?"
- 11 said, "I will not again see the LORD himself in the land of the living;
- no longer will **I look** on my fellow man, or be with those who now dwell in this world.
- 12Like a shepherd's tent my house has been pulled down and taken from me.
- Like a weaver I have rolled up my life, and he has cut me off from the loom;
- day and night you **made an end of me**.
- 13<mark>I waited</mark> patiently till dawn, but like a lion he broke all **my bones**;
- day and night you **made an end of me**.
- 14<mark>I cried</mark> like a swift or thrush, **I moaned** like a mourning dove.

My eyes grew weak as I looked to the heavens. I am being threatened; Lord, come to my aid!"



### Isaiah 38:9-14



#### King Hezekiah's Response

- Hezekiah's lament, before his praise
  - Laments express deep regret, grief, or sorrow\*
  - Lots of lament in the Bible (Psalms 10, 63, 69, 74, 79, and Lamentations)
- Importance of jotting things down
  - "The faintest ink is better than the mightiest memory" Chinese Proverb
  - Reminded of God's work
- Looks intensely at himself and his situation
  - Refers to himself using the pronouns I, me, and my 21 times in 6 verses
  - Refers to the LORD as He, Himself, LORD, and you, 7 times
  - "... viewed his life as fragile" as a temporary tent or piece of cloth taken away
  - Hezekiah looks up to the LORD for help



### Isaiah 38:15-20



King Hezekiah's Response

15But what can I say? He has spoken to me, and he himself has done this. I will walk humbly all my years because of this anguish of my soul.

16Lord, by such things people live; and my spirit finds life in them too. You restored me to health and let me live.

17Surely it was for my benefit that I suffered such anguish. In your love you kept me from the pit of destruction; you have put all my sins behind your back.

18For the grave cannot praise you, death cannot sing your praise; those who go down to the pit cannot hope for your faithfulness.

19The living, the living—they praise you, as I am doing today; parents tell their children about your faithfulness.

20The LORD will save me, and we will sing with stringed instruments all the days of our lives in the temple of the LORD.



#### Isaiah 38:15-20



#### King Hezekiah's Response

- Hezekiah's lament turns to praise
  - What can he say? (v15)
  - Changes focus from self to God and His provision
  - Only refers to himself as I, me, and my pronouns 14 times
  - Refers to God in broad ways as He, Himself, LORD, You, and Your 16 times
  - God provided more than he prayed for deliverance and forgiveness (v17)



### Isaiah 38:21-22



#### King Hezekiah's Response

21 Isaiah had said, "Prepare a poultice of figs and apply it to the boil, and he will recover."

**22**Hezekiah had asked, "What will be the sign that I will go up to the temple of the LORD?"



- Isolated here to provide emphasis
- 2 Kings 20:1-11 provides narrative with God's medical prescription for Isaiah
- Poultice typically a soft and usually warm mass of bread, meal, clay, herbs, or the like applied to sores or inflamed parts of the body
- Excited to praise God in the temple


