Is the dating of Daniel Reasonable?




- Owing to the availability of the Dead Sea Scrolls, it is possible to provide a linguistic comparison of the Aramaic and Hebrew chapters of Daniel and consider the vocabulary, morphology and syntax.
 - They date to the fifth or late sixth century BC.
 - Composed in the Eastern sector of the Aramaic-speaking world (e.g. Babylon vs Palestine)
 - Source: A Survey of Old Testament Introduction – Archer
- In view of the markedly later development in the areas of syntax, word-order, morphology, vocabulary, spelling, and word-usage, there is absolutely no possibility of regarding Daniel as contemporary [with other sectarian documents of the Maccabean era]. -- Archer
 - a standardized chronological division of the Aramaic language.
 - a. Old Aramaic (900 - 700 BC)
 - b. Official Aramaic (700 - 300 BC)
 - c. Middle Aramaic (300 BC - 200 AD)
 - d. Late Aramaic (200 - 700 AD)
 - e. Modern Aramaic (700 AD - present)



¹⁶ For we did not follow cleverly devised tales when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of His majesty. ¹⁷ For when He received honor and glory from God the Father, such an utterance as this was made to Him by the Majestic Glory, “This is My beloved Son with whom I am well-pleased” — ¹⁸ and we ourselves heard this utterance made from heaven when we were with Him on the holy mountain.

Edom and Moab and the main part of the Ammonites. 42 He shall stretch out his hand against the countries, and the land of Egypt shall not escape. 43 He shall become ruler of the treasures of gold and of silver, and all the precious things of Egypt; and the Libyans and the Ethiopians shall follow in his train. 44 But tidings from the east and the north shall alarm him, and he shall go forth with great fury to exterminate and utterly destroy many. 45 And he shall pitch his palatial tents between the sea and the glorious holy mountain; yet he shall come to his end, with none to help him.





Daniel 8:1-14 (ESV) Vision of Ram and Goat



⁹ Out of one of them came a little horn, which grew exceedingly great toward the south, toward the east, and toward the glorious land. ¹⁰ It grew great, even to the host of heaven. And some of the host and some of the stars it threw down to the ground and trampled on them. ¹¹ It became great, even as great as the Prince of the host. And the regular burnt offering was taken away from him, and the place of his sanctuary was overthrown. ¹² And a host will be given over to it together with the regular burnt offering because of transgression, and it will throw truth to the ground, and it will act and prosper. ¹³ Then I heard a holy one speaking, and another holy one said to the one who spoke, "For how long is the vision concerning the regular burnt offering, the transgression that makes desolate, and the giving over of the sanctuary and host to be trampled underfoot?" ¹⁴ And he said to me, "For 2,300 evenings and mornings. Then the sanctuary shall be restored to its rightful state."




Antiochus IV Epiphanes



- Known as one of the cruelest tyrants in history
- Gave himself the name Epiphanes; Illustrious, manifest god
- Dec 14, 168 BC – Alter used to sacrifice a pig
 - The abomination that makes desolate
- Dec 14, 165 BC – Temple purified, burnt offering restored
 - [Judas Maccabeus](#) defeated the [Seleucids](#)
 - Festival of Lights and Feast of Dedication: [Hanukkah](#)
- Timing:
 - 2300 “evenings and mornings”
 - 6 year advocates: High Priest Deposed -> Temple re-consecrated
 - 3 year advocates: Pagan alter -> Temple re-consecrated
- What did [Antiochus IV](#) foreshadow?






Daniel 11 Application
