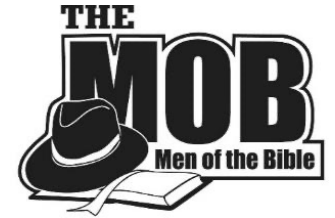


Section Overview



- The Corinthians are really having to pay attention to what Paul is saying – JUST LIKE US!
- This section is so related to us even when most churches today don't have to worry about idols, sort of!
- Today we don't think idolatry is a big deal like it was in Corinth, REALLY!
- There is so much emphasis on Israel in this section that we need to think about how this could apply to us!

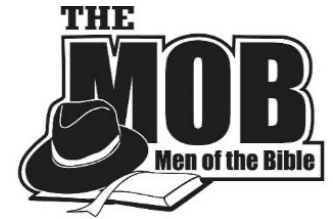
1 Corinthians 10:1-2 (ESV)



¹For I do not want you to be unaware, brothers, that our fathers were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea,
²and all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea,

- This section is all about why the Corinthians needed to understand that Israel was an example that Paul used to help them understand their relationship with God
- Since Paul baptized believers, he wanted them to see how all this began with the Israelites leaving Egypt with Moses.
- The “cloud” was God and because of that they were under His protection.
- Because Moses was the Jewish leader all the Jews were “baptized into Moses and the cloud and the sea” as an example of why the Corinthians were baptized.

1 Corinthians 10:3-5 (ESV)



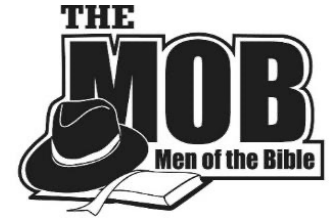
³ and all ate the same spiritual food,

⁴ and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank from the spiritual Rock that followed them, and the Rock was Christ.

⁵ Nevertheless, with most of them God was not pleased, for they were overthrown in the wilderness.

- Christ was really the “Rock” and this was similar to what Paul preached to them.
- He even told them that the ancient Jews, those 20 and over to those who were with Caleb and Joshua’s generation, died in the wilderness – except Caleb Joshua.
- This can be hard to understand because Paul was giving an example of the Jews being held out of the Promised Land due to their sins.
- Constable writes, “the Israelites have ceased to be God's chosen people, but God has temporarily set aside Israel and is presently working with a new chosen people: Christians (cf. Rom. 9-11). God accompanied the Israelites and provided for them faithfully in the past just as He does for all Christians”

1 Corinthians 10:6-8 (ESV)



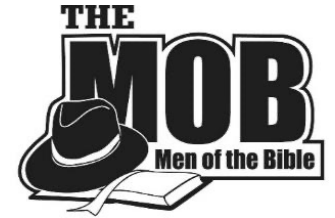
⁶ Now these things took place as examples for us, that we might not desire evil as they did.

⁷ Do not be idolaters as some of them were; as it is written, “The people sat down to eat and drink and rose up to play.”

⁸ We must not indulge in sexual immorality as some of them did, and twenty-three thousand fell in a single day.

- Paul’s writing this was to keep all of us on the “straight and narrow” way.
- Do not seek after the things that displease God, like “idolaters” do.
- In v.8, Paul uses 23,000 for those who died, and many see the term 24,000 used by Moses in Nu 25:9 to be a conflict. Most see this as an issue with Paul not using the leaders that participated, according to Dr C. All of this has to do with sexual immorality that still exists today!

1 Corinthians 10:9-11 (ESV)



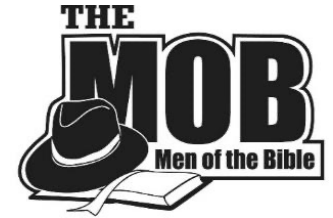
⁹ We must not put Christ to the test, as some of them did and were destroyed by serpents,

¹⁰ nor grumble, as some of them did and were destroyed by the Destroyer.

¹¹ Now these things happened to them as an example, but they were written down for our instruction, on whom the end of the ages has come.

- In v.9, Paul was referring to an event in OT times in Nu 21:6 where God sent “fiery serpents”.
- This event in v.10 is described in Nu 11:1-3 and many think the “Destroyer” is an angel of God.
- Dr. C says that v.11 is very important because it was written for us since we “live in the Last days”.

1 Corinthians 10:12-13 (ESV)



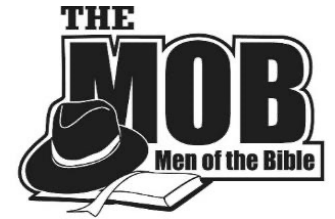
¹² Therefore let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall.

¹³ No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.

- Paul is warning them again like he did in 1 Cor 8:4-6.
- Dr. C says we all need to remember this verse, v.13, for all it says. Please discuss this in your group tonight.



Conclusion



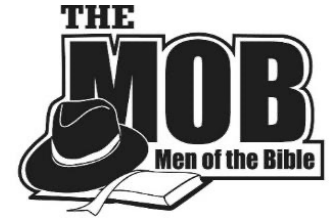

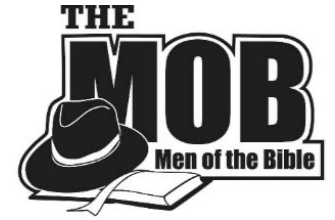


1. Why would Paul, in this passage, draw from the experience of “our fathers” in warning about the dangers of falling into sin and forsaking God?

4. How did “our fathers”—though “elected” and so highly favored by God-- misuse their new-found freedom, according to this passage?

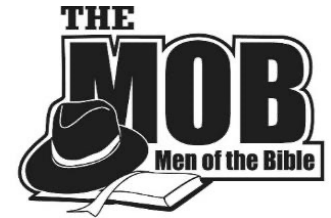

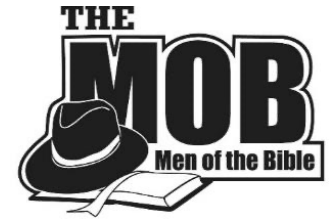
