





### "My Hope is Built on Nothing Less"






My hope is built on nothing less than Jesus' blood and righteousness: I dare not trust the sweetest frame, but wholly lean on Jesus' name.





When darkness veils His lovely face, I rest on His unchanging grace; in every high and stormy gale, my anchor holds within the veil.










## Isaiah 23 - Setting the Scene

"Ships of Tarshish" refers not to ships from a particular location, but to a class of ships: large vessels for long-distance trade.


For centuries they were based in Tyre and Sidon – the region known as Phoenicia or Canaan




- The original Tyre was a coastal city about 30 miles south of Sidon.
- Tyre was extended to include an island about ½ mile offshore.
   Eventually the island became the main city, partly because it was easier to defend.




## **Phoenician Colonies**



## **Description of Tyre**




- Your messengers crossed the sea and were on many waters (vv. 2-3)
- The grain of the Nile, the harvest of the River was her revenue (v. 3)
- The market of nations (v. 3)
- Jubilant city (v. 7)
- Whose origin is from antiquity (v. 7)
- Whose feet used to carry her to colonize distant places (v. 7)
- The bestower of crowns (v. 8)
- Whose merchants were princes (v. 8)
- Whose traders were the honored of the earth (v. 8)



- Tyre was all about "the mercenary motive that was ever the mainspring of Tyre's activity; all, as in prostitution, was done for money." (Motyer)
- The market of nations (v. 3)
- Known for its ships of Tarshish (v.1), merchants, traders (v.8)

### Isaiah 23:1



### Ezekiel 26:4

## **Some History**



- Tyre came under attack at least five times from Isaiah's day until its end. It's invaders were:
- Sennacherib (705-701 B.C.) Assyria
- Esarhaddon (679-671 B.C.) Assyria
- Nebuchadnezzar (585-573 B.C.) Babylon
- Artaxerxes III Ochus (343 B.C.) Persia
- Alexander the Great (332 B.C.) Macedonia





## **Mourning Over Tyre**




### <sup>1</sup> The oracle concerning Tyre.

<sup>4</sup> Be ashamed, O Sidon;


**Reap shame/derision**

   Egypt, too, will mourn




### Mourn the Ancient City

YHWH of armies


Why?






**Assyrian Army Attacks a City**


A Lesson

### **Ultimate Power**




<sup>11</sup> He has stretched His hand out over the sea,

  - Arise, pass over to Cyprus; even there you will find no rest."









### Forgotten





### History – The 70 Years




Sennacherib laid the mainland waste in 701 [BC] and did vast damage to Tyrian trade. According to Erlandsson 'only with the decline of Assyria around 630 [BC] did Tyre regain complete independence and the capability of creating new riches.'

### A Lesson




Judah and Jerusalem needed to learn from this prophecy against Tyre.

- Human glory is transitory, even for the rich and famous
- Business and the wealth of nations ultimately means nothing, so don't trust the nations!
- God is sovereign and powerful, even over the richest and strongest nations. Do trust in Him!

## **A Transformed Motive**



### This is an unexpected twist!


- Earnings set apart to the LORD

When? This has not happened yet. It will in THE MILLENNIUM






### A Lesson










- 1. Tarshish was over 2,000 miles from Tyre. Why would the ships of Tarshish wail over the destruction of Tyre?
