### Examples of Faith: Joseph

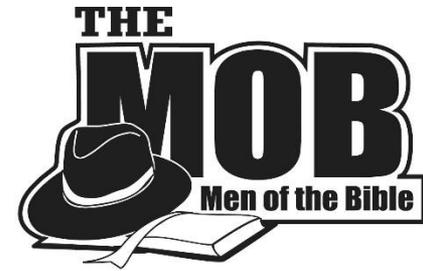


<sup>22</sup> By faith Joseph, at the end of his life, made mention of the exodus of the Israelites and gave directions concerning his bones.

### Examples of Faith: Joseph

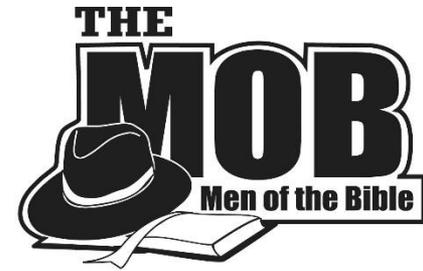


<sup>15</sup> When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, “It may be that Joseph will hate us and pay us back for all the evil that we did to him.” <sup>16</sup> So they sent a message to Joseph, saying, “Your father gave this command before he died: <sup>17</sup> ‘Say to Joseph, “Please forgive the transgression of your brothers and their sin, because they did evil to you.”’ And now, please forgive the transgression of the servants of the God of your father.” Joseph wept when they spoke to him. <sup>18</sup> His brothers also came and fell down before him and said, “Behold, we are your servants.” <sup>19</sup> But Joseph said to them, “Do not fear, for am I in the place of God? <sup>20</sup> As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today. <sup>21</sup> So do not fear; I will provide for you and your little ones.” Thus he comforted them and spoke kindly to them.


### Examples of Faith: Joseph



<sup>22</sup> So Joseph remained in Egypt, he and his father's house. Joseph lived 110 years. <sup>23</sup> And Joseph saw Ephraim's children of the third generation. The children also of Machir the son of Manasseh were counted as Joseph's own. <sup>24</sup> And Joseph said to his brothers, "I am about to die, but God will visit you and bring you up out of this land to the land that he swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob." <sup>25</sup> Then Joseph made the sons of Israel swear, saying, "God will surely visit you, and you shall carry up my bones from here." <sup>26</sup> So Joseph died, being 110 years old. They embalmed him, and he was put in a coffin in Egypt.



### Chronology of the Patriarchs



Jacob was born (when Isaac was 60; Gen. 25:26)	Jacob moved to Egypt (at age 130; Gen. 47:9) when Joseph was 39	Jacob died (at age 147, 17 years after he moved to Egypt; Gen. 47:28)

# Background for [Genesis 50:15](#) and what follows




- Even Pharaoh recognized that Joseph had a “divine spirit”, [Genesis 41:38](#)
- This is the second time Joseph has dealt kindly with his brothers, [Genesis 45:1-10](#)
- Joseph has consistently emphasized what God is doing from his interpretation of dreams (prisoners’ and Pharaoh’s) up to this point in time (i.e., dependence on God)



# Genesis 50:15-26 (ESV)

## Observation & Interpretation



<sup>16</sup> So they sent a message to Joseph, saying, “Your father gave this command before he died: <sup>17</sup> ‘Say to Joseph, “Please forgive the transgression of your brothers and their sin, because they did evil to you.”’ And now, please forgive the transgression of the servants of the God of your father.” Joseph wept when they spoke to him.

O: Since Joseph had already forgiven them, his brothers were worried that with their father gone he would exact revenge


O: The brothers even seem to be maneuvering Joseph with their words about, “the God of your father”

I: Joseph probably wept for many reasons but primarily that they didn’t believe him (or trust God)

## Observation & Interpretation



<sup>19</sup> But Joseph said to them, “Do not fear, for am I in the place of God?  
<sup>20</sup> As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today.  
<sup>21</sup> So do not fear; I will provide for you and your little ones.” Thus he comforted them and spoke kindly to them.


O: Joseph lets them know that he is not in the place of God, as it is God that exacts revenge, [Deuteronomy 32:35](#)

O: Even when his brothers were unsure of how things would go, Joseph was not



# Genesis 50:15-29 (ESV)

## Observation & Interpretation



<sup>24</sup> And Joseph said to his brothers, “I am about to die, but God will visit you and bring you up out of this land to the land that he swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob.” <sup>25</sup> Then Joseph made the sons of Israel swear, saying, “God will surely visit you, and you shall carry up my bones from here.”

O: Joseph had the same desire to be buried with his father and other patriarchs in the promised land


O: Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob would now become a common referral to God by the Jews

O: Joseph’s request was carried out by none other than Moses ([Exodus 13:19](#)) and Joshua ([Joshua 24:32](#))



# Hebrews 11:22 (ESV)

## Observation & Interpretation




<sup>22</sup> By faith Joseph, at the end of his life, made mention of the exodus of the Israelites and gave directions concerning his bones.

**O:** Joseph's faithfulness carried on even to his old age

**I:** At the end of his life Joseph was still remembering the promises and having others act on them for his behalf when he could not

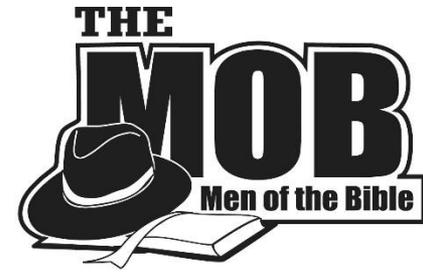





# Genesis 48:8-22 (ESV)

## Examples of Faith: Joseph




<sup>8</sup> When Israel saw Joseph's sons, he said, "Who are these?" <sup>9</sup> Joseph said to his father, "They are my sons, whom God has given me here." And he said, "Bring them to me, please, that I may bless them." <sup>10</sup> Now the eyes of Israel were dim with age, so that he could not see. So Joseph brought them near him, and he kissed them and embraced them. <sup>11</sup> And Israel said to Joseph, "I never expected to see your face; and behold, God has let me see your offspring also." <sup>12</sup> Then Joseph removed them from his knees, and he bowed himself with his face to the earth. <sup>13</sup> And Joseph took them both, Ephraim in his right hand toward Israel's left hand, and Manasseh in his left hand toward Israel's right hand, and brought them near him. <sup>14</sup> And Israel stretched out his right hand and laid it on the head of Ephraim, who was the younger, and his left hand on the head of Manasseh, crossing his hands (for Manasseh was the firstborn).



# Genesis 48:8-22 (ESV)

## Examples of Faith: Joseph




<sup>15</sup> And he blessed Joseph and said,  
“The God before whom my fathers Abraham and Isaac walked,  
the God who has been my shepherd all my life long to this day,  
<sup>16</sup> the angel who has redeemed me from all evil, bless the boys;  
and in them let my name be carried on, and the name of my fathers  
Abraham and Isaac;  
and let them grow into a multitude in the midst of the earth.”  
<sup>17</sup> When Joseph saw that his father laid his right hand on the head of  
Ephraim, it displeased him, and he took his father's hand to move it  
from Ephraim's head to Manasseh's head. <sup>18</sup> And Joseph said to his  
father, “Not this way, my father; since this one is the firstborn, put your  
right hand on his head.” <sup>19</sup> But his father refused and said, “I know, my  
son, I know. He also shall become a people, and he also shall be great.  
Nevertheless, his younger brother shall be greater than he, and his  
offspring shall become a multitude of nations.”



# Genesis 48:8-22 (ESV)

## Examples of Faith: Joseph



<sup>20</sup> So he blessed them that day, saying,  
“By you Israel will pronounce blessings, saying,  
‘God make you as Ephraim and as Manasseh.’”  
Thus he put Ephraim before Manasseh. <sup>21</sup> Then Israel said to Joseph,  
“Behold, I am about to die, but God will be with you and will bring you  
again to the land of your fathers. <sup>22</sup> Moreover, I have given to you rather  
than to your brothers one mountain slope that I took from the hand of  
the Amorites with my sword and with my bow.”
