Observation

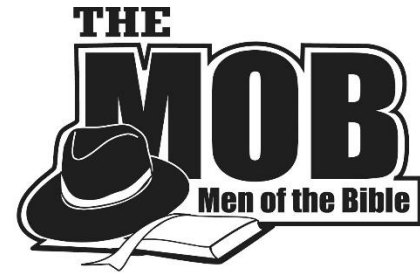


²³ By faith Moses, when he was born, was hidden for three months by his parents, because they saw that the child was beautiful, and they were not afraid of the king's edict. ²⁴ By faith Moses, when he was grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, ²⁵ choosing rather to be mistreated with the people of God than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin. ²⁶ He considered the reproach of Christ greater wealth than the treasures of Egypt, for he was looking to the reward. ²⁷ By faith he left Egypt, not being afraid of the anger of the king, for he endured as seeing him who is invisible. ²⁸ By faith he kept the Passover and sprinkled the blood, so that the Destroyer of the firstborn might not touch them. ²⁹ By faith the people crossed the Red Sea as on dry land, but the Egyptians, when they attempted to do the same, were drowned.

Interpretation

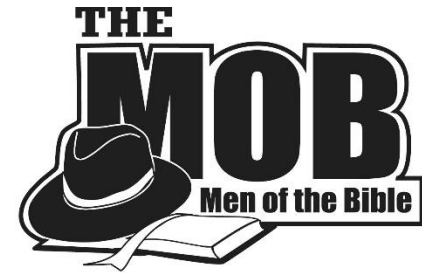


- Several elements / varieties of faith in the life of Israel's greatest prophet leader:

Faith in the Life of Moses

Interpretation



- Faith of Moses' parents: [Exodus 2:1-4](#)
 - Moses' parents were Levites
 - 300(+) years... Moses' parents remembered their lineage
 - Moses' parents coupled their faith with action
 - Cole: "Faith is not opposed to using prudence."
 - Moses' parents had faith in something, but not the details, yet they were still faithful
 - Cole: "God often works through the faith of unknown parents or grandparents to raise up an unusually gifted leader."

Interpretation

- Moses' faith to withstand mistreatment:
[Exodus 2:15, 3:1, 5:19-21](#)

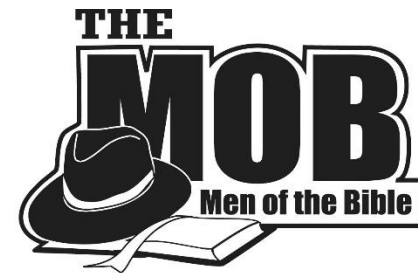


- Cole: “When you choose to follow Christ – which may involve walking away from the education and comfortable lifestyle your family has provided you – you will suffer the pain of alienation and being misunderstood.”
- Young: “Stubborn sheep prepared him to lead a stubborn Jewish nation.”



Faith in the Life of Moses

Interpretation



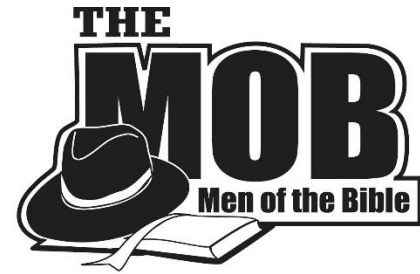
- Faith in looking forward to the reward:
[Hebrews 11:16](#), [Deut 18:15](#), [John 5:46-47](#), [John 8:56](#)
- Moses knew that God had something in store... Moses eventually wrote of God's promise to raise up a prophet
 - Moses also wrote of God's promise to Eve ([Genesis 3:15](#))
- Moses' choice of faith required weighing the short-term against the long-term, and was carefully considered
 - [Jim Elliot](#) and team, Ecuador, 1956:
"He is no fool who gives what he cannot keep to gain that which he cannot lose."
 - [Luke 9:25](#)





Faith in the Life of Moses

Interpretation

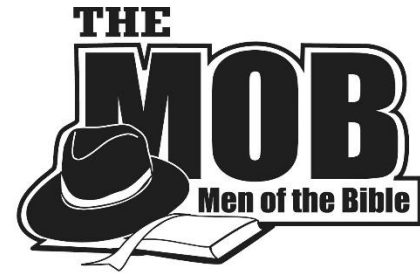


- Faith in leaving Egypt: [Hebrews 11:27](#), [Exodus 3:1-10](#), [Exodus 33:11](#), [John 14:9](#), [Hebrews 11:1](#), [Philippians 4:6-7](#)
- A. W. Pink: “Faith and fear are opposites, and yet...they are often found dwelling in the same breast; but where one is dominant, the other is dormant.”
- Cole: “Faith overcomes powerful opposition by seeing the unseen God.”
 - Burning bush ([Exodus 3](#))
 - Moses speaking with God
 - He who has seen Jesus has seen the Father ([John 14:5-14](#))
 - Be anxious in nothing ([Philippians 4:6-7](#))



Faith in the Life of Moses

Interpretation

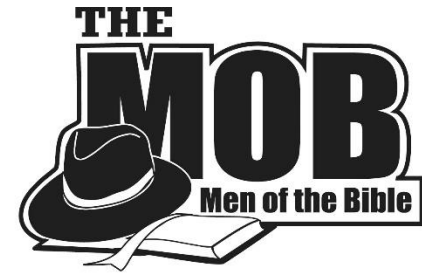


- What is **faith**?
 - Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. (Hebrews 11:1 ESV)
 - Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. (Hebrews 11:1 KJV)
 - Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see. (Hebrews 11:1 NIV)
 - Now faith is the reality of what is hoped for, the proof of what is not seen. (Hebrews 11:1 HCSB)
 - Now if we have faith, we are sure that our hopes are real, we come to know that the unseen things really do exist. (Hebrews 11:1 Translators)



Faith in the Life of Moses

Interpretation

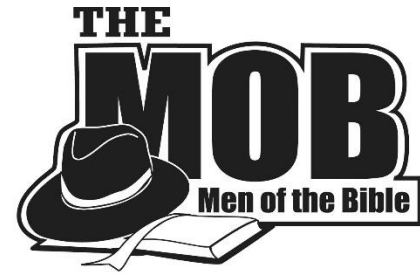


- Moses' faith in implementing the rites of the Passover:
[Exodus 12:1-7,12-13](#); [Romans 3:23-25a](#); [1 John 2:2](#),
[Ephesians 2:8](#)
- Cole: "Faith trusts in God's sacrifice for deliverance from God's judgment."
 - All people face the threat of God's impending judgment
 - God has appointed a way of deliverance through the blood of a substitute
 - God's way of deliverance must be applied by faith to be effective



Faith in the Life of Moses

Interpretation



- Faith of the people in crossing the Red Sea:
[Exodus 14:15-31](#)
[Acts 27:22-26, 41-44](#)
- Cole: “Faith does not exempt us from overwhelming problems, but rather it often leads us into such problems.”
- God delights to turn our overwhelming problems into exhibitions of his mighty power.

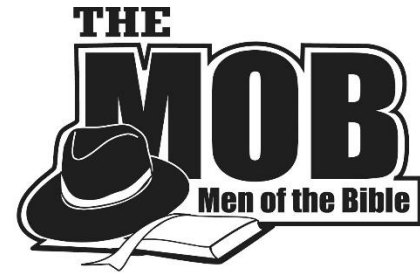

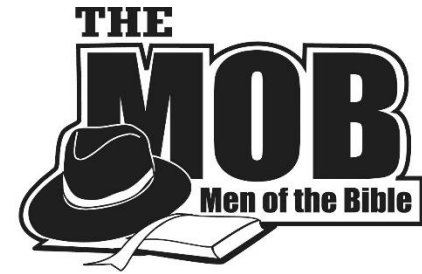
Application Questions

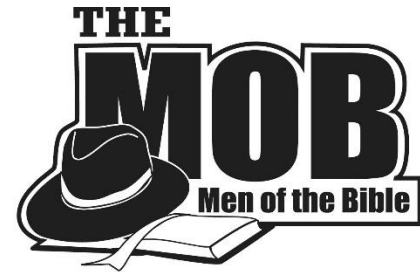
