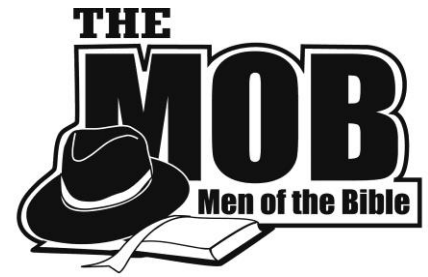
1 John 5:6-13 (ESV) **Assurance of Salvation**



⁶ This is he who came by water and blood - Jesus Christ; not by the water only but by the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one who testifies, because the Spirit is the truth. ⁷ For there are three that testify: ⁸ the Spirit and the water and the blood; and these three agree. ⁹ If we receive the testimony of men, the testimony of God is greater, for this is the testimony of God that he has borne concerning his Son. ¹⁰ Whoever believes in the Son of God has the testimony in himself. Whoever does not believe God has made him a liar, because he has not believed in the testimony that God has borne concerning his Son.



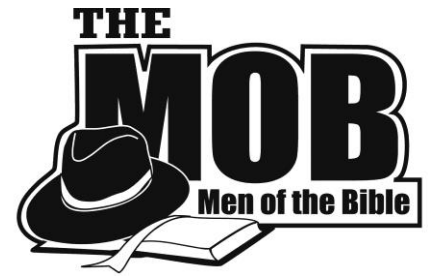
1 John 5:6-13 (ESV) **Assurance of Salvation**



¹¹ And this is the testimony, that God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. ¹² Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life. ¹³ I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God that you may know that you have eternal life.



1 John 5:14-17 (ESV) Guidance in Prayer



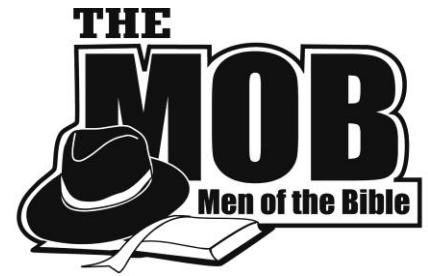
¹⁴ And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us.

¹⁵ And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him.

¹⁶ If anyone sees his brother committing a sin not leading to death, he shall ask, and God will give him life - to those who commit sins that do not lead to death. There is sin that leads to death; I do not say that one should pray for that. ¹⁷ All wrongdoing is sin, but there is sin that does not lead to death.



[1 John 5:18-21](#) (ESV) **Freedom from Habitual Sin**



¹⁸ We know that everyone who has been born of God does not keep on sinning, but he who was born of God protects him, and the evil one does not touch him.

¹⁹ We know that we are from God, and the whole world lies in the power of the evil one.

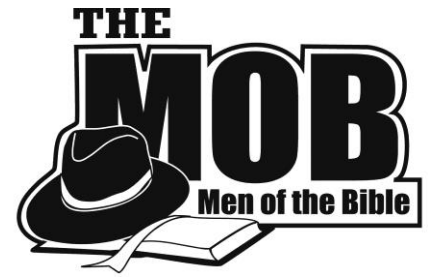
²⁰ And we know that the Son of God has come and has given us understanding, so that we may know him who is true; and we are in him who is true, in his Son Jesus Christ. He is the true God and eternal life.

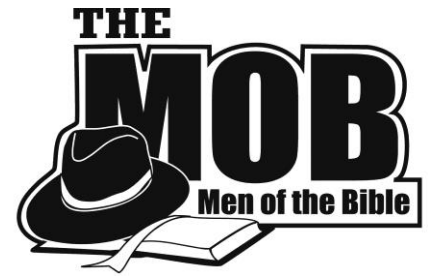
Observation

1 John 5:6-21 Interpretation

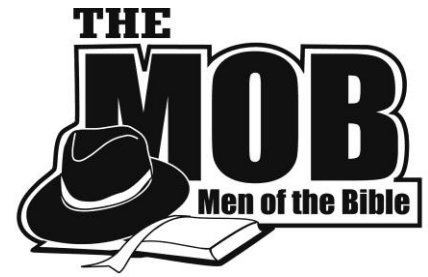


- Possible Interpretations to “Water” and “Blood” in 1 John 5:6-7:
 1. Baptism and the Lord’s Supper
 2. Symbolic of the water and blood that flowed from Jesus’ side at death
 3. “Water” refers to His baptism and “blood” refers to His death

Observation (Continued)

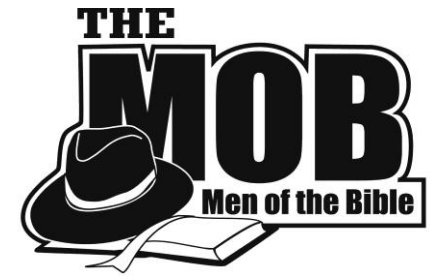


- 1 John 5:15 - What is meant by, “we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him”?
- Does this mean that Christians should always expect to receive from God what they ask for?

Observation (Continued)

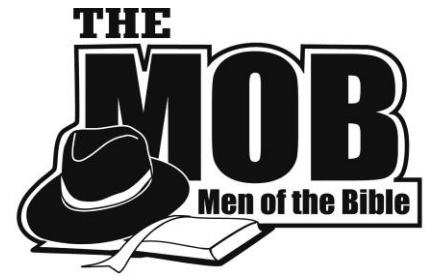


- 1 John 5:16 - Who is meant by “brother”?
- 1 John 5:16 - What is meant by “sin that leads to death”?



1 John 5:6-21

Interpretation (Continued)

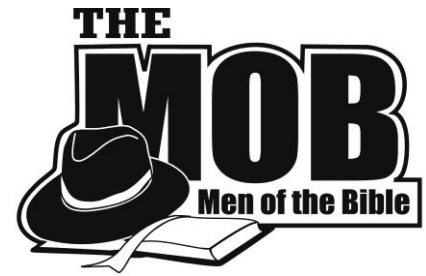


- “Brother” may mean “fellow Christians” or more generally “people” or “neighbors”
- Possible meanings of “sin that leads to death”:
 1. A specific sin or act
 2. A lifestyle of sin
 3. Apostasy or renunciation of Christ and/or the Christian faith
 4. Blasphemy against the Holy Spirit

Interpretation (Continued)

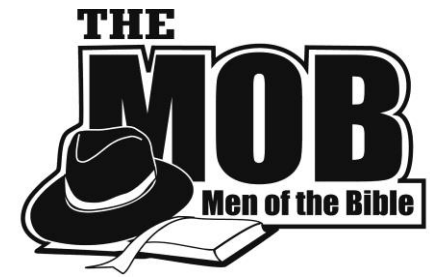


- What is meant by “does not keep on sinning” in 1 John 5:18?
- Considering the historical context at the time of John’s writing, why may John have ended his letter with a warning to keep away from “idols” in 1 John 5:21?

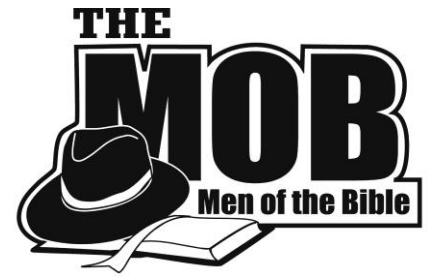
Application / Discussion

Pastoral:

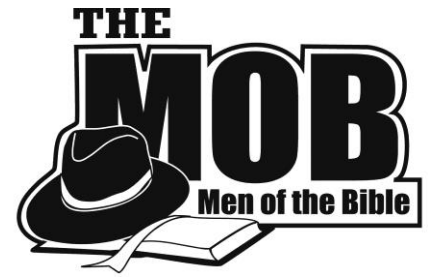
- “that you too may have fellowship” ([1 John 1:3](#))

- “concerning those trying deceive you” ([1 John 2:26](#))
- “make sure no one deceives you” ([1 John 3:7](#))
- “test the spirits” ([1 John 4:1-3](#))
